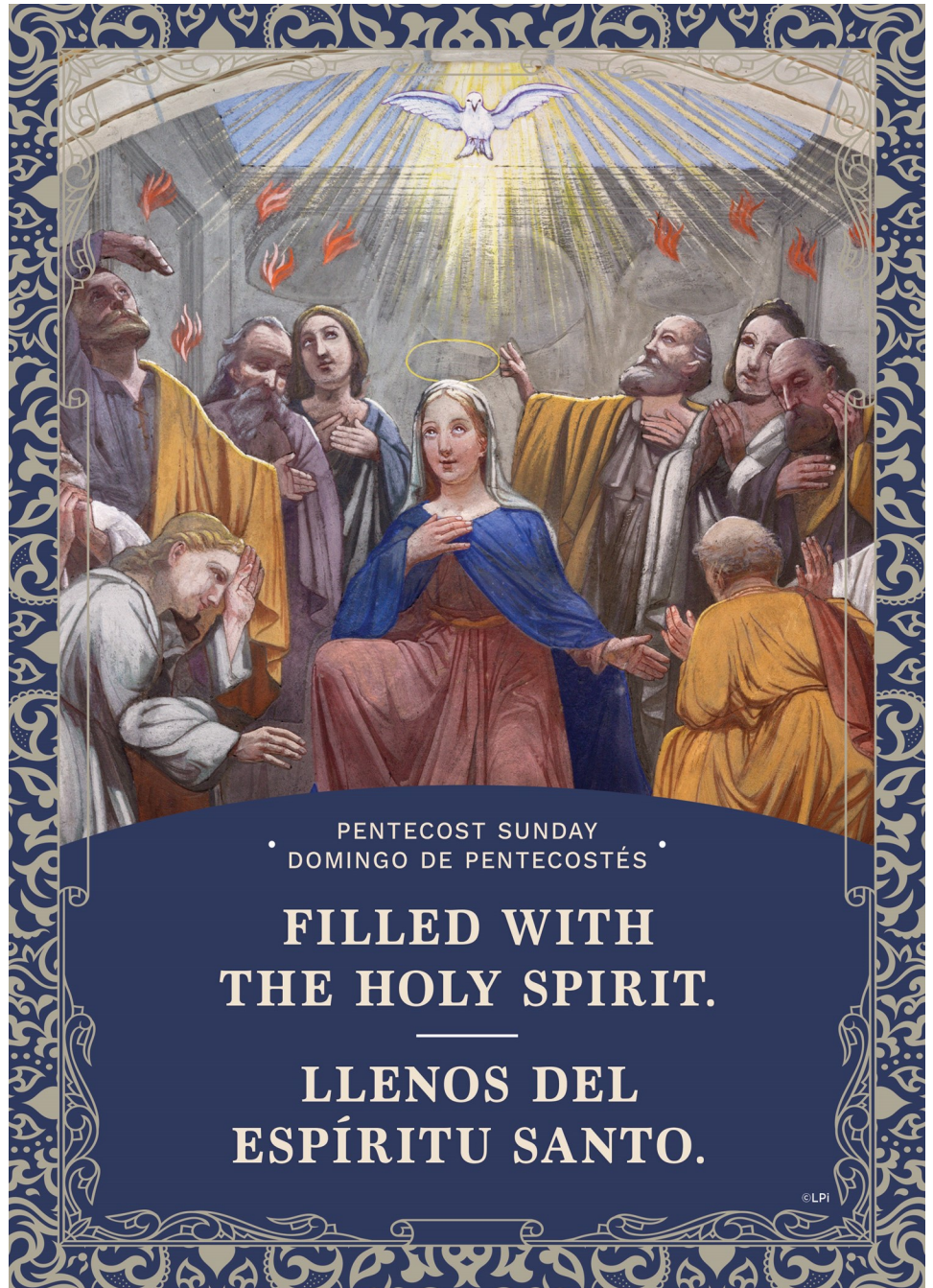

A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Happy Pentecost!

The church celebrates this solemn occasion when the Holy Spirit came upon the Apostles and began the outward mission of the Gospel. The readings give us complementary pictures of what the Spirit does. The Holy Spirit gives power to speak God's deeds so that many can hear and He gives peace and forgiveness so that hearts can be healed and made new.



The Apostles were *"all together in one place,"* and then *"came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind"* that filled the house. Tongues *"as of fire"* appeared, and the Apostles were *"filled with the Holy Spirit,"* so that they *"began to speak in other tongues."* So Pentecost teaches us something important about evangelization. The Gospel is not meant to be kept locked up inside a small circle of "the already convinced." The Holy Spirit overcomes distance between cultures, between classes, between native languages and everyday speech so that the good news can be understood.

In the Gospel reading, the disciples are gathered with fear. The consoling words of our Blessed Lord as he enters he says: *"Peace be with you."* As He breathes new life on the apostles, Jesus connects the gift of the Spirit to the healing of sin: *"Receive the Holy Spirit."*

Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Our Lord relieves the fear of the apostles by offering us something to ponder. Seek reconciliation rather than resentment. If there is someone you need to forgive, or if you need to return to the Lord in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, Pentecost is a fitting time to begin.

May the same Spirit who filled the Apostles fill our hearts, and may the peace of the risen Christ reign in our homes and in our parish.

¡Feliz Pentecostés!



La Iglesia celebra esta solemne ocasión en la que el Espíritu Santo descendió sobre los apóstoles y dio inicio a la misión evangelizadora. Las lecturas nos ofrecen imágenes complementarias de lo que hace el Espíritu. El Espíritu Santo nos da el poder de anunciar las obras de Dios para que muchos puedan escucharlas, y nos da paz y perdón para que los corazones puedan sanar y renovarse.

Los apóstoles estaban *"todos juntos en un mismo lugar,"* y entonces *"de repente se oyó un gran ruido que venía del cielo, como cuando sopla un viento fuerte,"* que llenó la casa. Aparecieron lenguas *"como de fuego,"* y los apóstoles fueron *"llenados del Espíritu Santo,"* de modo que *"empezaron a hablar en otras lenguas."* Así, Pentecostés nos enseña algo importante sobre la evangelización. El Evangelio no está destinado a permanecer encerrado en un pequeño círculo de "los ya convencidos." El Espíritu Santo supera la distancia entre culturas, entre clases, entre lenguas nativas y el lenguaje cotidiano para que la buena noticia pueda ser entendida.

En la lectura del Evangelio, los discípulos se encuentran reunidos, llenos de temor. Al entrar, nuestro Señor les dirige unas palabras consoladoras: *"La paz esté con ustedes."* Al infundir nueva vida a los apóstoles, Jesús vincula el don del Espíritu con la sanación del pecado: *"Reciban el Espíritu Santo. A los que les perdonen los pecados, les quedarán perdonados; y a los que no se los perdonen, les quedarán sin perdonar."* Nuestro Señor alivia el temor de los apóstoles ofreciéndonos algo en qué reflexionar. Busquen la reconciliación en lugar del resentimiento. Si hay alguien a quien necesitan perdonar, o si necesitan volver al Señor en el Sacramento de la Reconciliación, Pentecostés es un momento adecuado para comenzar.

Que el mismo Espíritu que llenó a los apóstoles llene nuestros corazones, y que la paz de Cristo resucitado reine en nuestros hogares y en nuestra parroquia.

Virtues, Explained! Piety

"Piety denotes the reverence which we give to our faith and to our country," writes St. Thomas Aquinas. "And since God is the Father of all, the worship of God is also called piety."

Piety, Explained!

Piety is one of the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit and is related to the virtue of justice.

St. Thomas Aquinas writes, "Piety denotes the reverence which we give to our faith and to our country. And since God is the Father of all, the worship of God is also called piety...therefore the gift whereby a man, through reverence for God, works good to all, is fittingly called piety." (Sum., II:II, 68, Art. 4)

The virtue of piety, which can be understood most easily as giving due reverence to God, should not be confused with "popular piety," which refers to external expressions of devotion that are unique to specific places and environments. The virtue of piety describes a person's fulfillment of their duty to God and the precepts of the Church; popular piety describes other practices that enliven their desire to fulfill that duty.

Novena to Saint Joan of Arc

Above all, obtain for me the grace to one day meet God face to face and with you and Mary and all the angels and saints praise Him through all eternity. O most powerful Saint Joan, do not let me lose my soul, but obtain for me the grace of winning my way to heaven, forever and ever.
Amen.

St. Joan of Arc | May 30

St. Joan of Arc (1412 – 1431) has had her story told throughout history through many books, movies and plays. She was born in the village of Domrémy, near the province of Lorraine, to a French peasant family. At a young age, she began to experience visions and voices, which were later identified to be of St. Michael, St. Catherine of Alexandria, and St. Margaret of Antioch. At the age of 13, all three saints told her that she was to drive the English from French territory, and that she must bring the Dauphin to Reims for his coronation. Trusting in God, she did as she was told.

During the Hundred Years War, St. Joan of Arc led French troops against the English and recaptured the cities of Orléans and Troyes. Captured near Compiègne the following year, she was sold to the English and placed on trial for heresy and witchcraft, eventually being found guilty and burned at the stake in Rouen.

St. Joan of Arc was canonized by Pope Benedict XV on May 16, 1920, and is the patron saint of military members.

REFLECTIONS

RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Mini reflection: Much of what Jesus does in his resurrected Body is extraordinary and superhuman. He's passing through locked doors. He's in two places at once. But today, he's just breathing. So we have to ask ourselves: why?

Signs of Life

If you're asthmatic, you know the phrase "as natural as breathing" doesn't always make a lot of sense.

Maybe that's because breathing isn't always natural. Sometimes, it's supernatural.

I come from a family of asthmatics. In my earliest childhood memories, my sister's nose and mouth are covered with a bulbous plastic mask connected by clear tubes to her transportable nebulizer. The machine whirs loudly as it vaporizes the medication that will open her lungs. In these memories, I watch my sister — her little eyes wide, her chest contracting and constricting with great difficulty — and wonder what it feels like.

Because I don't have asthma, and I don't think about breathing, unless I'm climbing a flight of stairs or chasing down one of my kids. It's such a utilitarian thing, breathing. It's unimpressive, unremarkable. Literally anyone can do it.

Until they can't.

Dead men don't breathe. That's what I think as I read the words of John's Gospel: "He breathed on them." (John 20:22) So much of what Jesus does in his resurrected Body is extraordinary and superhuman, making it unmistakable that here is a Body no longer playing by the rules of the physical world. He's passing through locked doors. He's in two places at once.

But today, he's just breathing.

Question:

What do the colors of the priest's and deacon's vestments mean?

Answer:

In the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church, the colors of the vestments evolved over the course of several centuries and there was wide variation both in the colors used, and in the feasts and seasons associated with particular colors. It was Pope Innocent III (d. 1216) who gave us the basic outline that was later prescribed by Pope Saint Pius V in 1570. The various colors remind us of the dominant themes of a particular season or celebration.

- **White:** Used for the seasons of Christmas and Easter and in celebrations of the Lord, of Mary, the angels, and saints who were not martyrs. This color is also used in Masses for the dead, at baptisms, weddings and other festive celebrations.
- **Red:** As the color of both blood and fire, red is used on Palm Sunday and Good Friday, as well as Pentecost and special celebrations of the Holy Spirit. Moreover, red is used on the feasts and memorials of the Apostles and those saints who died as martyrs.
- **Violet:** The color for Advent and Lent. Violet may also be used in Masses for the dead and on All Souls Day (November 2).
- **Green:** A color of life and hope, green is used throughout Ordinary Time.
- **Other colors:** Rose may be used on the Third Sunday of Advent and the Fourth Sunday of Lent, black may be used in Masses of the dead and on All Souls Day, gold or silver may be used on solemn occasions in place of white, red, or green.

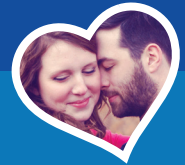

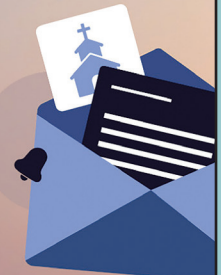
