Religious Education for children in Catholic Schools - 2021-2022

Cost:

\$80 for one child

\$130 for two children

\$155 for three or more children

- Parents will register at St. Joan of Arc parish and declare their option for Catholic School.
- Parents are required to attend the first two (2) Parent meetings for Religious Education. Parents are welcome to attend any of the remaining parent meetings. Families are also welcome to participate in the community events that will take place several times in a semester.
- Except for the community events as listed on the schedule, which families may attend as they wish, children will be educated at Catholic School and at home. Those parents who would like their children to attend the catechetical sessions for children offered at the parish are invited to register for the Parish Religious Education program instead.
- It is expected that Families will be attending Mass *each* Sunday (or Saturday Vigil Mass).

Sacramental Preparation Specific Considerations

- Children preparing for the Sacrament of First Reconciliation will participate in the parish's First Reconciliation retreat.
- Children who have received the Sacrament of First Reconciliation and are preparing for the Sacraments of Confirmation and First Holy Eucharist will participate in the parish's Confirmation/First Holy Eucharist retreat.
- All children preparing to receive a sacrament must pass an interview according to the standards at St. Joan of Arc, demonstrating adequate formation in understanding and giving a free response to the grace of the sacraments, as explained in the Diocese of Phoenix sacramental guidelines and policies.
- Reception of the Sacraments of Initiation and First Penance will take place at St. Joan of Arc parish.

Curriculum

- Parents have the option of receiving one "A Family of Faith" Parent guide and one "A Family of Faith" Activity book for each child (eighth grade and younger) who is registered. Please let the Coordinator of Religious Education know if you would *not* like this option.
- Children will receive faith formation and sacramental preparation at the Catholic school. Parents of children preparing for sacraments are responsible for assuring that children receive and are formed in the guidance and essential teachings presented in the Diocesan policy and guidelines documents for the Sacraments.
